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### Introduction

The Global Partnership for Education Fund (GPEF) was established as a Financial Intermediary Fund in 2011 as part of the rebranding process of the Education for All-Fast Track Initiative (EFA-FTI), which started in 2002. The World Bank acts as the Trustee for the GPEF.

The Trustee provides administrative and financial services to the GPE Board and Contributors by receiving contributions from Contributors, investing liquid assets pending cash transfer, and transferring funds to Grant Agents. Working closely with the GPE Secretariat, the Trustee also records funding decisions made by the GPE Board.

The Trustee is required to provide periodic reports to the Board on the financial status of the Trust Fund<sup>1</sup>. This report is prepared based on financial information as of March 31, 2021.

## **GPEF Trust Fund Financial Summary as of March 31, 2021**

#### Contributions:

Each Contributor enters into a Contribution Agreement or Arrangement with the Trustee to make a contribution to the GPEF. As of March 31, 2021, the Trustee had entered into Contribution Agreements/Arrangements with 27 Contributors for a total of <u>USD eq. 5,103.5 million</u> in contributions, of which the Trustee has received <u>USD eq. 4,985.1 million</u> in cash from these Contributors.

#### Investment Income:

As of March 31, 2021, the GPEF Trust Fund earned investment income of approximately <u>USD 88 million</u> on the undisbursed balance of the Trust Fund.

#### **Funding Approvals:**

The cumulative funding decisions made by the GPE Board through March 31, 2021 totaled <u>USD 5,670.1 million</u>. Of the total amount approved, USD 4,750.6 million represents Program Implementation Grant approvals. The Trustee has committed a total of USD 4,502.4 million based on the instruction from the GPE Secretariat. The cumulative funding decisions are greater than the funds received from Contributors owing to the GPE's rapid response to the COVID-19 pandemic, which included \$500 million in support for COVID-19 response activities. To facilitate this response, the GPE Board approved a carryover in terms of funds required from the next financing period (2021-2025) to cover outstanding grant disbursements on approvals made in the current financing period.

#### Cash Transfers:

Based on GPE Board funding decisions and in accordance with the terms of the Financial Procedures Agreements between the Trustee and the Grant Agents, the Trustee has transferred a total of <u>USD 4,280.6 million</u> up to March 31, 2021. Of this USD 3,826.9 million was for projects that include Program Implementation Grants, Program Development Grants, Multiplier, Knowledge and Innovation Exchange, Global and Regional activities, Education Plan Development Grants, Civil Society Education Fund, Better Early Learning and Development at Scale, Advocacy and Social Accountability, Assessment for Learning, Gender Responsive Education Sector Planning and Country Level Admin.

#### Funds Held in Trust and Funds Available for GPE Board Funding Decisions:

*Funds Held in Trust* reflects contributions paid-in from Contributors, investment income, and net cash transfers. Funds Held in Trust as of March 31, 2021 amounted to <u>USD 792.5 million</u>.

*Funds available* for the Trustee's commitment amounted to USD 570.6 million as of March 31, 2021, a decrease of USD 84.2 million compared to December 31, 2020.


## 3. Investment Management

#### **ASSET MIX**<sup>4</sup>

Funds held in trust by the World Bank (as the Trustee) are maintained in a commingled investment portfolio (the "Pool") for all trust funds administered by the World Bank.

The World Bank employs the Conditional Value-at-Risk (CVaR) measure as the risk constraint in the management of trust funds. GPEF funds are managed such that the expected maximum loss, as measured by the CVaR, at the portfolio's investment horizon, is not to exceed 1% with 99% confidence.

The negative position in swaps is primarily due to changes in foreign exchange (FX) rates in cross currency basis swaps, which are used to implement currency hedges on bond positions within the portfolio.



#### **INVESTMENT INCOME**

GPEF funds are invested in a short and medium horizon portfolio of the World Bank's trust fund investment pool. This portfolio comprises investments in government bonds and money markets with an investment horizon of up to three years. The GPEF Trust Fund liquid portfolio (which totaled approximately USD 792.5 million at end-March 2021) has returned -0.24% through the calendar year to March 31, 2021 and earned approximately USD 88 million in investment income since inception. The portfolio witnessed negative returns during the first quarter of 2021 due to steepening of yield curves which negatively affected returns of longer-term fixed income assets.

#### FOREIGN EXCHANGE (FX) RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustee has made progress in recent months toward exploring a comprehensive FX management solution for the entire Trust Fund (TF) and Financial Intermediary Fund (FIF) portfolio, including GPE. The Trustee (Development Finance) has been leading a working group comprising relevant corporate units across the WB, including WB Treasury, Legal, Accounting and Risk management department to examine the governance, legal, operational, and technical (systems) requirements of FX management (hedging) solution. A comprehensive examination of all areas to date has identified the necessary requirements and challenges, as well as preliminary proposals for WB management's review and consideration. Once formalized, the proposed solution will require approvals within the World Bank's internal governance framework including the Finance and Risk Committee chaired by the WBG CFO.

### GPEF Trust Fund

Given the size and magnitude of Trust Fund (TF) and Financial Intermediary Fund (FIF) portfolio, any proposal would follow a phased approach i.e., through a pilot of one or two Trust Funds/FIFs to inform a broader-based FX management solution for the entire TF and FIF portfolio. Based on the work done thus far, offering a FX management solution on a pilot basis by the end of CY21, or early in CY22 remains feasible. To be efficient and effective, the development of the FX management strategy should be coupled with a movement to having all donors sign multi-year contribution agreements with defined payment schedules.

With GPE's upcoming replenishment in mind, the Trustee remains fully committed to supporting GPE by developing an FX management solution, including the possibility of offering GPE to be the first pilot.




### **Funding Decisions by Activity**

The cumulative funding decisions made by the GPE Board up to March 31, 2021 amount to USD 5,670.1 million. Of these decisions, 84% went to Program Implementation Grants, 5% to Administrative Budget, 3% each to Multiplier and Agency Fees, 1% each to Education Plan Development Grant, Civil Society Education Fund, Supervision Allocations, Advocacy and Social Accountability and Knowledge and Innovation Exchange, and less than 1% each to Global and Regional Activities, Program Development Grants, Assessment for Learning, Gender Responsive Education Sector Planning, Country Level Admin, and Better Early Learning & Development at Scale.
